Carrie Booth Walling is Assistant Professor of Political Science at Albion College. Her research and teaching interests are in the areas of human rights, international security and global justice. Walling studies why mass atrocity crimes happen and how states and international organizations respond to them – particularly through humanitarian intervention and international courts. Her book, *All Necessary*

Measures: The United Nations and Humanitarian Intervention (University of Pennsylvania Press, 2013), contends that the arguments Security Council members make about the cause and character of conflict and the source of sovereign authority in target states matter: they enable or constrain the use of military force in defense of human rights.

Walling has published articles on ethnic cleansing and international criminal justice in the *Journal of Peace Research*, *International Journal of Human Rights*, *Civil Wars* and *New Global Studies*. Walling teaches courses in human rights, transitional justice, international law and organizations, gender and international politics, international ethics and the causes of war. She earned her BA in International Relations from James Madison College, Michigan State University and Masters degrees in Strategic Studies and Political Science from the University of Wales, Aberystwyth and the University of Minnesota, respectively. Walling earned her PhD in Political Science with a minor in Human Rights from the University of Minnesota. She was a postdoctoral fellow with the Michigan Society of Fellows at the Gerald R. Ford School of Public Policy, University of Michigan (2008-2011) before joining the Political Science Department at Albion College.
